The 2021 Optu Red Mountain entices with a flourish of sweet herbs, tobacco, blood orange and dried black cherry. This is surprisingly energetic, with cool-toned red and black fruits accelerated by juicy acidity as a hint of sour citrus adds further complexity toward the close. The 2021 displays exceptional balance and lift, tapering off long and staining with sweet tannins and a spicy sensation.

More round and forward, with lush blackcurrants, lavender, tobacco, and smoky, underbrush notes, the 2021 Optu Red Mountain is medium to full-bodied, beautifully balanced, has ripe tannins, and a great finish. It already offers pleasure but should evolve for 10-15 years on its balance. The blend is 66% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, and the balance Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc, raised in one-third new French oak, with 10% in new American oak.
